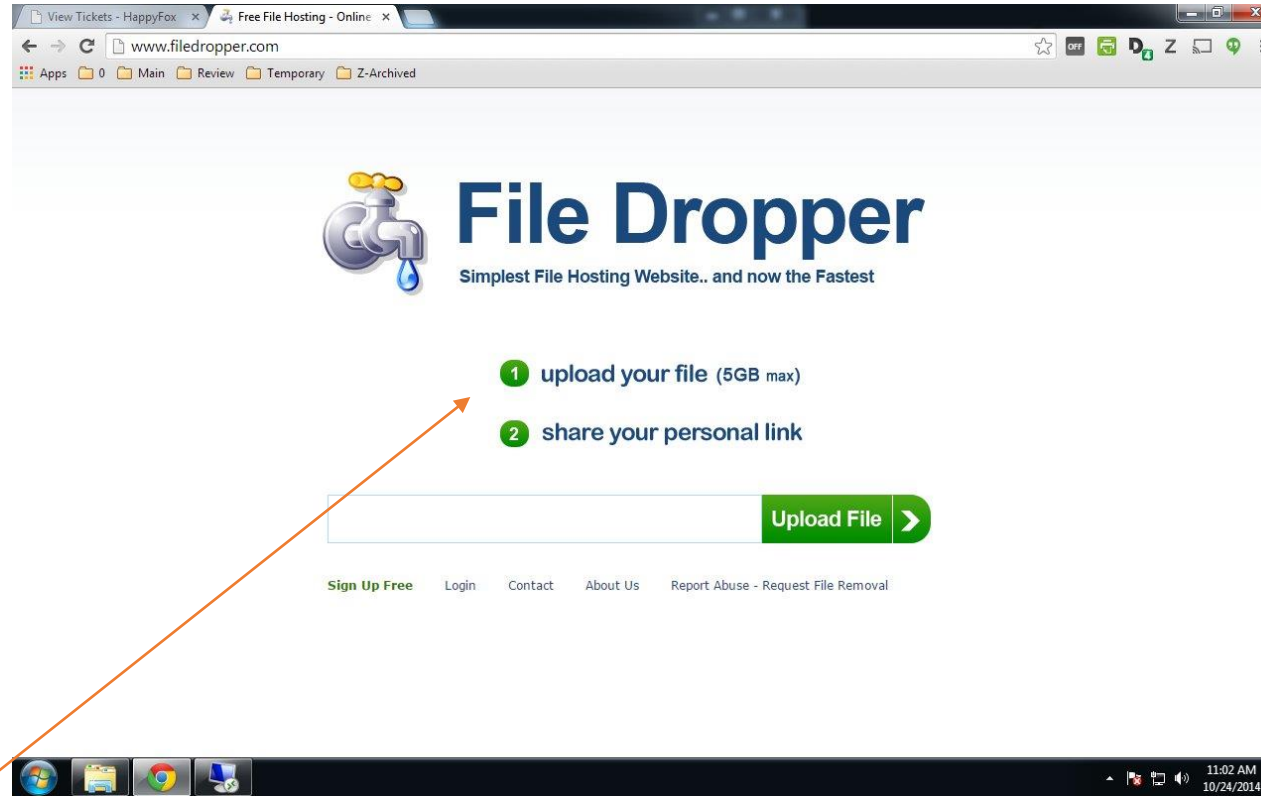
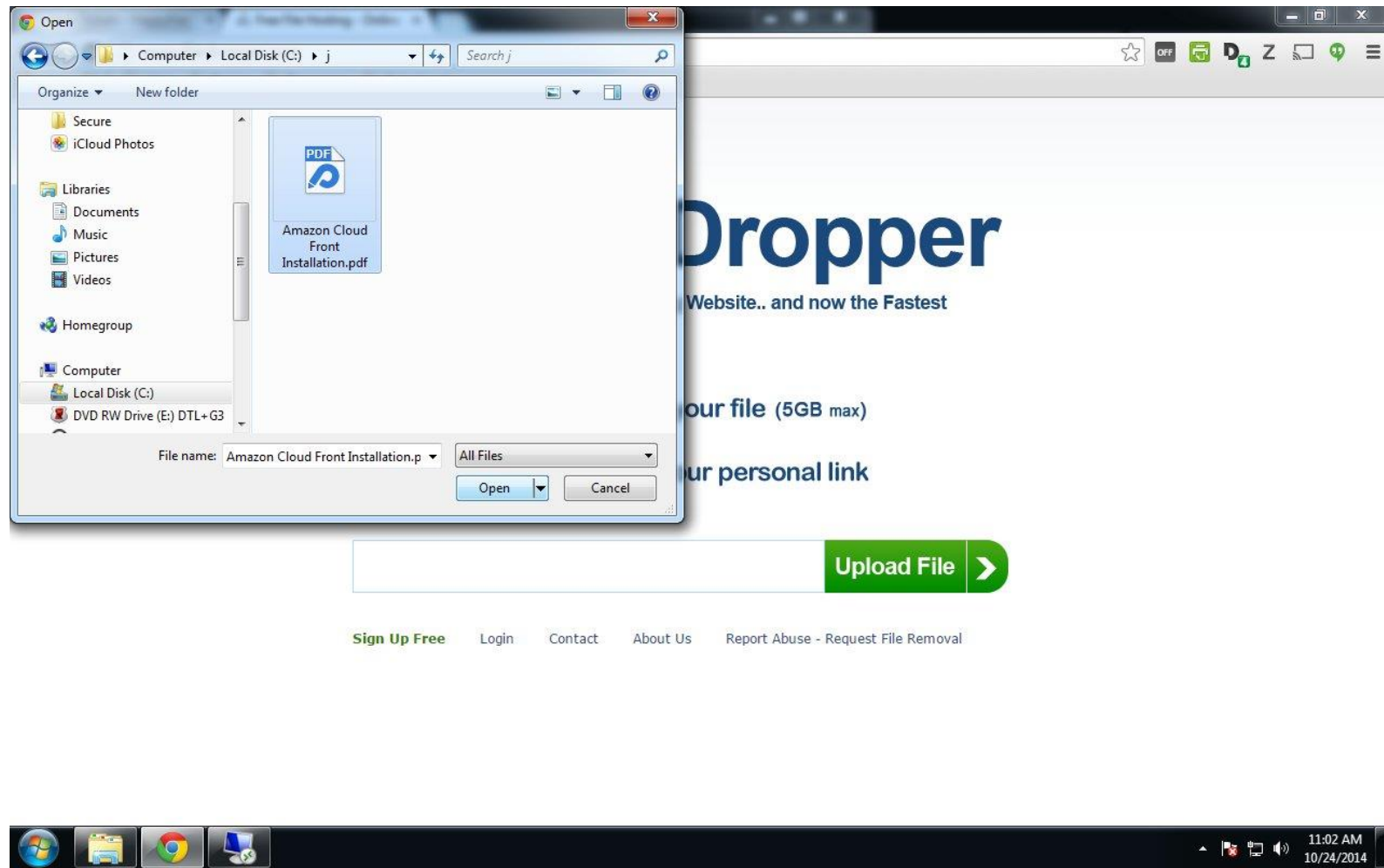


Using File Dropper To Send Large Files



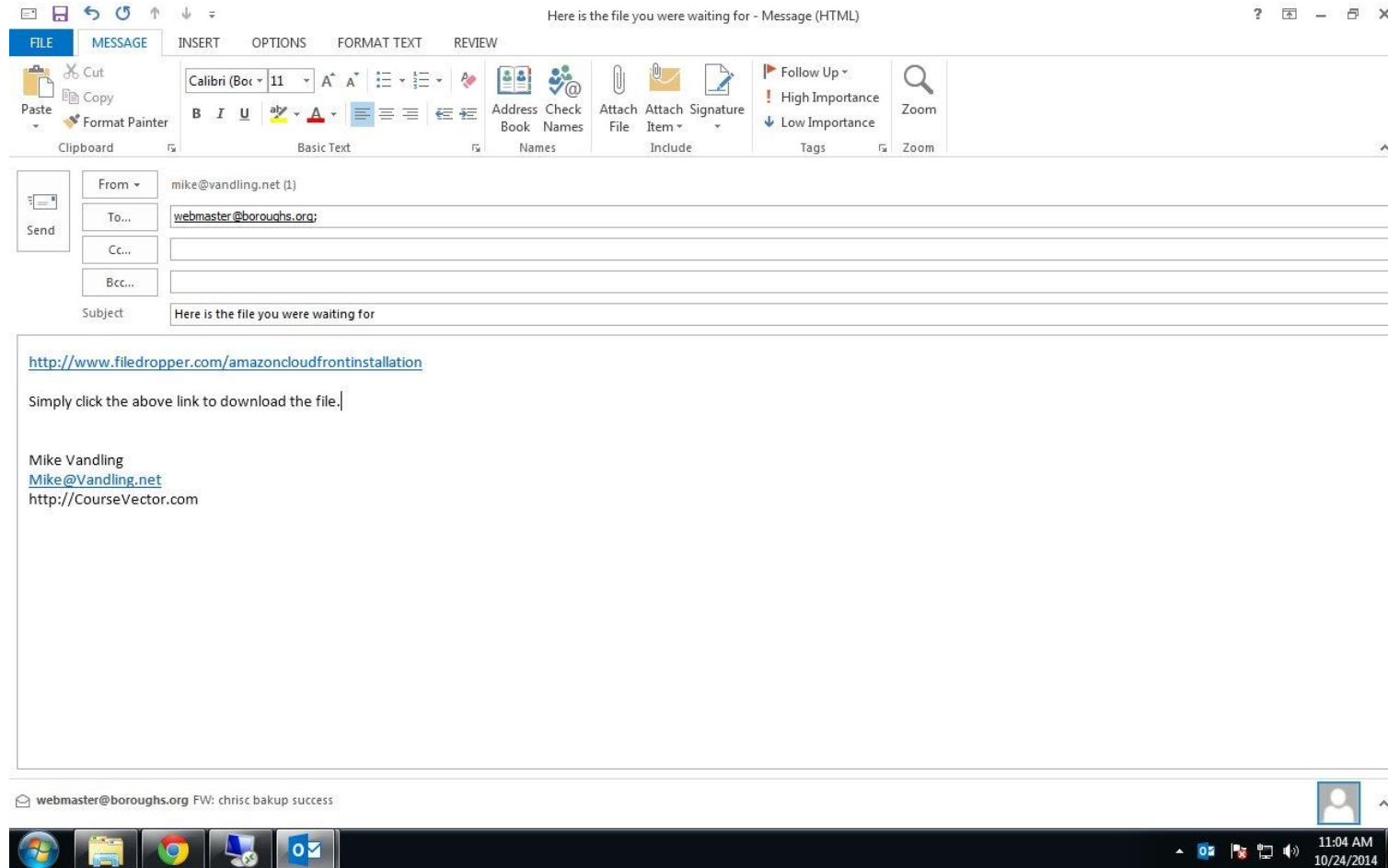
Go to <http://filedropper.com> Click on upload your file.



Choose the file from your hard drive that you want to send.
