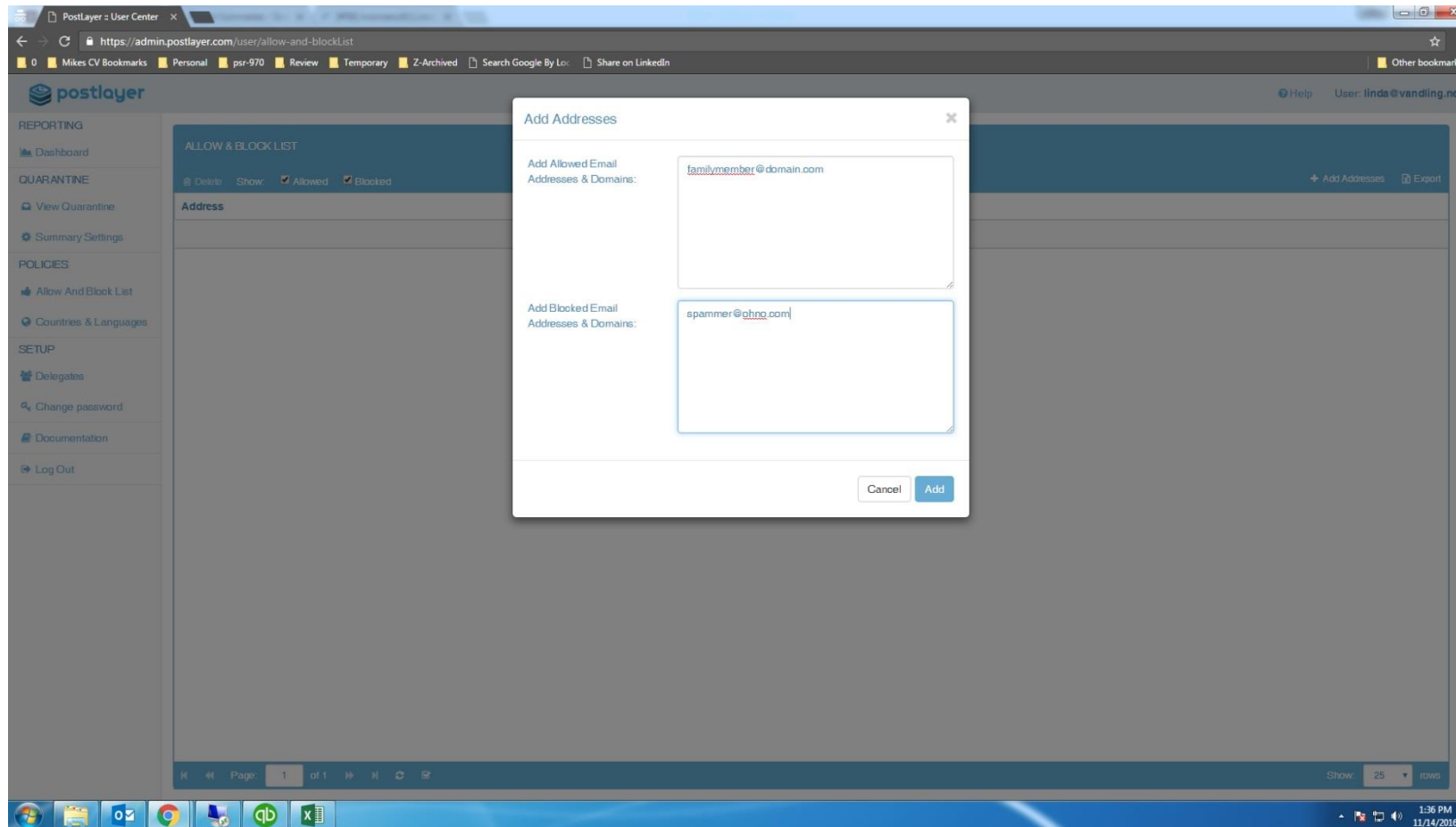

Under View Quarantine, you can see all of the spam that has been blocked. You can Preview, Deliver or Forward email from this interface. We would suggest you Preview ANY email prior to Delivering it. Almost all of the email are here for a reason. You could be forwarding a virus or phishing link. Quarantined emails are available for up to 30 days.

Most settings and training is done by CourseVector. These settings are updated periodically and behind the scenes. However, if you find CourseVector is sending an email to spam that you want, or, they are not blocking one that you wish to be blocked, you can do so through the Allow Add Block List.



In this example we are allowing all email from familymember@domain.com, regardless of what CourseVector's behind the scenes settings are. Please be very careful with this as viruses, phishing links and other dangerous emails will also be allowed through from individuals in your allow list.

Alternatively, we are blocking **all** email from spammer@ohno.com. Nothing will reach you from this email address regardless of CourseVector's settings.
